| <p>Individual liberty</p>  | <p>In PSHE we enable students to develop their self-knowledge, self-esteem and self-confidence (MHWB) Students are encouraged to ask questions, make independent choices, and take intellectual risks within a high challenge/low threat environment (CEIAG). We seek to create the conditions within which students can make informed choices (RSHE, CEIAG) Students are encouraged to know, understand and exercise their rights and personal freedoms, and are advised on how to exercise safely.</p> |
| <p>Mutual Respect</p>  | <p>Respect is central to the ethos of our school, and is modelled by students and staff alike. Students are encouraged to explore ideas and develop opinions, always understanding that disagreement does not entail loss of respect for and understanding of others' opinions. Students are also encouraged to challenge others behaviour which they find disrespectful.</p> |
| <p>Democracy</p>  | <p>Students discuss the Legal systems in the UK and how this knowledge can then be used to make changes to the school and curriculum through Student Voice and the Student Leadership Team. Students hold debates within lessons around key local and national issues and have an opportunity to meet with our local MP.</p> |
| <p>Freedom of faiths and beliefs</p>  | <p>We encourage students to accept responsibility for their behaviour, show initiative and understand how they can contribute positively to the lives of those living and working in our community as well as the wider society. Students are given the opportunity to explore and understand their place in the UK's culturally diverse society, and they are given the opportunity to experience diversity within the Academy and wider community. Students learn about Diversity, Democracy and Extremism.</p> |
| <p>The rule of law</p>  | <p>We teach students to distinguish right from wrong and to respect the civil and criminal law of England; All students, when they join the school, are made aware of the safeguarding policy and procedures, and codes of conduct. Students are taught the value of and the reasons behind the rules, their own responsibilities and conduct. These protocols are visited in PSHE lessons.
