






Fundamental British Values in Philosophy and RE

<p>Individual liberty</p> 	<p>Students learn about the vast diversity of beliefs and worldviews in modern Britain, as well as the basis of the belief that humans are endowed with free will.</p>
<p>Mutual Respect</p> 	<p>Students are regularly involved in discussion and debates, and learn to listen respectfully to alternative viewpoints.</p>
<p>Democracy</p> 	<p>The innate value of every human is explored during Judaism and Christianity modules, with an emphasis on the need for everyone's voice to be heard in our society.</p>
<p>Freedom of faiths and beliefs</p> 	<p>Students are taught about the major world religions, as well as several other worldviews, with specific reference to how these are practised in modern Britain, and their protection in British law.</p>
<p>The rule of law</p> 	<p>Students learn about the importance of the rule of law in Philosophy and Ethics modules, and explore what the alternative might look like; with an emphasis upon the need for law and order in a functioning society.</p>
