

Each and every one of us has the right to be protected from harassment or discrimination in relation to nine recognised protected characteristics in line with the Equality Act 2010














You must not be treated less favourably for being a particular age or within a range of ages, unless the treatment can be justified.


















You must not be discriminated against because of your religion or belief, or because of a lack of a religion or belief.













You must not be treated less favourably because of your sexual orientation, whether you are attracted to your own sex, the opposite sex or to both sexes.



The rule of law













The Equality Act protects you from discrimination because of race. Race means your colour, your nationality, your ethnicity, or national origins.

The Equality Act protects women from being discriminated against because they are pregnant, including due to pregnancy-related illness, or if you are a new mother.

Sex refers to being a man or a woman. You must not be discriminated against because of your sex.

You must not be discriminated against because you are transitioning or intend to transition from your sex assigned at birth.













You must not be discriminated against at work because you are married or in a civil partnership, whether your partner is of the same or the opposite sex.




