Dear Parents/Carers

I am writing to express my thanks for supporting us in maintaining our high standards of uniform. As the majority of our students are meeting our expectations, we will put in place a reward system. If your child goes two weeks without any uniform infringement they will receive five achievement points which they can use at the school reward shop.

For the small minority of students who are not wearing the correct uniform, we will be issuing an after school detention. Our uniform expectations are set out here.

Students not in the correct uniform will be expected to correct it (take off jewellery, remove socks with logos etc) and will be given a behaviour point. If they get three behaviour points for incorrect uniform in one day they will receive an automated 30 minute detention on that day. If your child does not attend the after school detention this will be escalated to a one hour detention the following day. If they refuse to attend both detentions students will be placed into isolation (RESTART). If students continue to persistently refuse to wear the correct uniform then we will hold a meeting with you, as this will be classed as persistent defiance and they will be suspended if no change happens.

If you have any questions about the guidance, please do not hesitate to contact school or refer to the uniform expectations on the website. If you are unsure whether a piece of uniform is acceptable, please consult the school before buying. If there are any extenuating circumstances, which mean you are unable to meet the uniform requirements by Monday 29 January, please email: pcs-enquiries@swale.at
