Changes to Child fares from 1st January 2026 - Message from Brighton & Hove Buses

From 1st January 2026, child fares will be available up until 31 August following a young person's 18th birthday. This means child fares will continue to support those in further education and through the summer holidays.

To pay a child fare, young people aged 14–18 may need to prove their age if they aren't in school uniform. To avoid the risk of being charged an adult fare, we recommend getting verified in advance.

Verification is quick and easy:

- Use the in-app child verification, or
- Get a Child BusID card, available from our travel shop on North Street, Brighton, or from the depot at 43 Conway Street, Hove.

RE: Year 10 Work Experience – Monday 6-Friday 10 July 2026

During the week beginning **Monday 6 July 2026**, all Year 10 students will complete a week's work experience. This is a placement with an employer in which a young person carries out a range of tasks in much the same way as an employee, with the emphasis on learning from the experience. Work experience provides opportunities for learning about the skills, behaviours, careers, roles and structures that exist within a workplace.

Work experience is seen as an important part of the curriculum and supports young people to make career decisions, develop work related skills and support successful transition into further and higher education, apprenticeships and the workplace.

We encourage students to find their own placements, as this helps to develop their resourcefulness, self-confidence and initiative, as well as helping to secure the placement of their choice. This is especially important within the current labour market. Their placement could be with parents/carers or other relatives, family/friend connections, or simply by approaching an employer in a sector that they are interested in directly.

All own placement employers **MUST** have Employers Liability Insurance. The placement cannot be considered without it. Please check that the employers have this before submitting your own placement request.

The deadline for submitting an own placement is Friday 23 January 2026.

The reason that we need all placement requests submitted by this date is to give us time to ensure that a member of the East Sussex County Council work experience team is able to make visits to every placement provider, to undertake a pre-placement visit. This will check the health and safety management arrangements of the business to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our students.

Careful consideration must be given to what sort of activities may be possible in a placement and whether it would be enjoyable and rewarding. For example, many might like to gain experience of working in a solicitor's office but, due to client confidentiality, some of the tasks that the student is allowed to do can sometimes be quite limited.

Once students have found their placements and these have been agreed with the placement provider, please can details be sent to emma.lane@swale.ac.uk or handed to a member of the PCS Library team.

Please note that if your child is successful in being allocated their placement choice on completion of the health and safety check, it will not be possible to change their placement at a later date if they 'change their mind'.

You will also be required to complete a 'Medical and Contact' details form (this will be sent out nearer the time). There is a duty to ensure employers know in advance about students who might be at greater risk, for example due to health conditions or specific learning needs, so they can take these properly into account. It is essential that any medical or other significant information that may affect your child's health and safety is provided. Permission will always be sought before such information is shared, but please note that a placement cannot go ahead if permission is not received.



For those students who are struggling to arrange their own placement, we have ensured that support is available through our dedicated online portal.

We have issued all year 10 students with a username and password so that they can access the official work experience website: <https://www.careerseastsussex.co.uk>

Within this website, students will find a comprehensive list of all placement opportunities we currently have available within East Sussex.

Next Steps for Students:


1. Log in to the website using the username and password provided.
2. Review the opportunities and select the placement that is of interest.
3. Submit the placement request to me (via the website mechanism or email, as instructed) in order for me to try and confirm the arrangement with the employer.

It is essential that students submit their choices promptly so we can confirm their placement well in advance of the start date. If they have misplaced their login details, please ask them to come to the library at break or lunch for a replacement.


Each student will have a Google form in their PDI Google Classroom. Every student in years 7, 8 and 9 must fill this in.

When will I find out if I have been accepted on to an activity that needs payment if I don't yet know?


Once we have received all of the choices we will then set up parent pay accordingly. You will receive an email letting you know if and when parent pay has been set up for you.
