It is important to note that even if a child does not take up the meal, a successful application still enables your school to receive additional funding through the pupil premium.

### Reminder - Food Hall, Topping Up Accounts

Please note that if students do not have money in their dinner accounts they will not be served by staff in the Food Hall.

We would like to remind parents/carers of the following:

- dinner accounts can be topped up via ParentPay (if you are having difficulties accessing ParentPay, please email us at pcs-enquiries@swale.at)
- in your account settings a notification can be set up to alert you as to when your child's ParentPay account balance is low
- students with biometric (fingerprint) consent can check their account balance daily using our balance checker, located by our Student Support Desk at Reception
- students entitled to Free School Meals should budget their allowance across break and lunch (if their entire allowance is spent at morning break time, no more purchases can be made at lunch)
- if students' accounts cannot be topped up for the following day in order to make a purchase in the Food Hall, they should bring a packed lunch instead

If your child purchases their lunch from the Food Hall, please ensure their accounts are topped up the day before as balances in accounts do not update instantly.

**Dear PCS Families** 

We are writing to you today with an important update regarding our proactive measures to maintain a safe and secure environment for all students at Peacehaven Community School.

As part of a sustained commitment to student safety, Peacehaven Community School is actively collaborating with the East Sussex Police to educate and safeguard our young people from the risks associated with knife and weapon-related crimes.

As a measure within this initiative, a Knife Arch will be installed inside the school on **Thursday 20 November**, starting at **8.15am**.

- Student procedure: All students will be asked to walk through the arch.
- Search protocol: If the arch detects any potentially dangerous items, students may be subject to a bag search.

We want to be clear: there is no specific issue with knife crime at Peacehaven Community School. This measure is being introduced as an important preventive and educational step in light of recent national news and growing concerns across the country. We extend our sincere thanks to the East Sussex Police for their continued support in this vital work.

We also want to reassure you that we are aware that students with Special Educational Needs (SEND) may require a different experience when going through the Arch. Our SEND team will be on hand to provide the necessary support to these students.

The safety of our young people requires a strong partnership between schools, the police, and families. Parents and carers play a vital role in this effort by remaining aware and having open, honest conversations with their children about the dangers of carrying weapons.

It is critical for young people to understand the realities:

- **Severe Consequences**: Being found in possession of a knife is a serious crime with severe consequences, impacting future education, employment, and travel opportunities and, most critically, posing a significant risk to life.
- False Protection: Some young people mistakenly believe carrying a weapon offers protection or enhances their status. The unfortunate reality is that they are statistically more likely to become victims of serious violence themselves.
- Shared Responsibility: Parents and carers should be mindful that girls may sometimes
  be pressured to carry or store weapons for others (e.g. boyfriends or male friends),
  believing they are less likely to be stopped. Possession of a knife or weapon is a crime,
  regardless of who it belongs to or the circumstances.

It is an offence to carry a knife in a public place (such as a road or in a school) or to carry any article which has a blade or is sharply pointed.

It is also an offence to carry an offensive weapon in a public place. This includes any article made, adapted or intended for causing injury eg: knuckle duster or bayonets, broken bottles.

- Carrying a knife includes: in your hand, a pocket, in the boot of your car or if someone else is carrying a knife for you.
- Exceptions include if you are carrying the knife as part of your job, such as a tool for a trade. However, forgetfulness, ignorance to the law or general self-defence are not reasonable excuses if you are caught carrying a knife.
- It is an offence to use any knife in a threatening way (even a legal knife).
- It is also an offence to sell a knife to anyone under 18. If you are concerned that your child has been sold a knife, you can contact the Citizens Advice Bureau to report the trader to Trading Standards.

#### Warning signs

These signs don't always mean the worst is happening and could just be normal teenage Behaviour:

- 1. Have they become withdrawn from the family and/or school?
- 2. Is their school or college reporting worrying changes in behaviour, academic achievement or attendance?
- 3. Have they lost interest in positive activities such as sports clubs?
- 4. Do they stay out unusually late without giving a reason and are vague about their whereabouts?
- 5. Have they stopped seeing old friends and started hanging out with a new group?
- 6. Are they secretive about the contents of their bag?
- 7. Are they defensive if you ask what is in their possession or if they are hiding anything?
- 8. Has their attitude changed about carrying knives/weapons? For example, justifying it by saying people carry them for self-defence?
- 9. Have any items gone missing from the kitchen, toolbox or garage?
- 10. Have you found a weapon hidden amongst their possessions?

How to support your child is you are worried

Dear Parents/Carers

### RE: Year 10 Work Experience - Monday 6-Friday 10 July 2026

During the week beginning **Monday 6 July 2026**, all Year 10 students will complete a week's work experience. This is a placement with an employer in which a young person carries out a range of tasks in much the same way as an employee, with the emphasis on learning from the experience. Work experience provides opportunities for learning about the skills, behaviours, careers, roles and structures that exist within a workplace.

Work experience is seen as an important part of the curriculum and supports young people to make career decisions, develop work related skills and support successful transition into further and higher education, apprenticeships and the workplace.

We encourage students to find their own placements, as this helps to develop their resourcefulness, self-confidence and initiative, as well as helping to secure the placement of their choice. This is especially important within the current labour market. Their placement could be with parents/carers or other relatives, family/friend connections, or simply by approaching an employer in a sector that they are interested in directly.

All own placement employers **MUST** have Employers Liability Insurance. The placement cannot be considered without it. Please check that the employers have this before submitting your own placement request.

#### The deadline for submitting an own placement is Friday 23 January 2026.

The reason that we need all placement requests submitted by this date is to give us time to ensure that a member of the East Sussex County Council work experience team is able to make visits to every placement provider, to undertake a pre-placement visit. This will check the health and safety management arrangements of the business to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our students.

Careful consideration must be given to what sort of activities may be possible in a placement and whether it would be enjoyable and rewarding. For example, many might like to gain experience of working in a solicitor's office but, due to client confidentiality, some of the tasks that the student is allowed to do can sometimes be quite limited.

Once students have found their placements and these have been agreed with the placement provider, please can details be sent to <a href="mailto:emma.lane@swale.at">emma.lane@swale.at</a> or handed to a member of the PCS Library team.

Please note that if your child is successful in being allocated their placement choice on completion of the health and safety check, it will not be possible to change their placement at a later date if they 'change their mind'.

You will also be required to complete a 'Medical and Contact' details form (this will be sent out nearer the time). There is a duty to ensure employers know in advance about students who might be at greater risk, for example due to health conditions or specific learning needs, so they can take these properly into account. It is essential that any medical or other significant information that may affect your child's health and safety is provided. Permission will always be sought before such information is shared, but please note that a placement cannot go ahead if permission is not received.

For those students who are struggling to arrange their own placement, we have ensured that support is available through our dedicated online portal.

We have issued all year 10 students with a username and password so that they can access the official work experience website: https://www.careerseastsussex.co.uk

Within this website, students will find a comprehensive list of all placement opportunities we currently have available within East Sussex.

### **Next Steps for Students:**

- 1. Log in to the website using the username and password provided.
- 2. Review the opportunities and select the placement that is of interest.
- 3. Submit the placement request to me (via the website mechanism or email, as instructed) in order for me to try and confirm the arrangement with the employer.

It is essential that students submit their choices promptly so we can confirm their placement well in advance of the start date. If they have misplaced their login details, please ask them to come to the library at break or lunch for a replacement.

### **Work Experience A Guide for Students**

### What is a work experience placement?

A placement with an employer in which a young person carries out a range of tasks in much the same way as an employee, with the emphasis on learning from the experience. Work experience provides opportunities for learning about the skills, behaviours, careers, roles and structures that exist within a workplace.

# How do you benefit from a work experience placement?

Work experience supports you to make career decisions, develop employability skills and support successful transition into FE, HE, apprenticeships and the workplace.

- More confidence
- Improved self esteem
- Ability to communicate with adults
- Improved timekeeping
- Additional practical work skills
- Team working
- Problem Solving skills
- Time management and organisation
- Clarifies job roles within industry
- Broadens horizons in relation to career routes and job roles available

### How to find a work experience placement?

Work experience can only take place from year 10 onwards. At PCS, Mrs Lane is our Work Experience Coordinator. You can talk to her about the different options to find a placement. She is available Tuesday - Friday and is based in the school Library.



### Before your work experience placement?

It is recommended that you arrange a pre-placement meeting before the placement starts. This will allow you to have a 'practice run' for the travel element, to see the business premises and meet with your contact so it is not so daunting on the first day. It will also provide a valuable opportunity to ask questions such as;

- What time should you arrive and what time will you finish?
- Where to report to on the first day and to whom
- What are break/lunch arrangements is there somewhere to buy lunch or should you bring a packed lunch?
- What is the dress code and do you need to provide any PPE (Personal protective equipment e.g. protective footwear)
- Do you need to bring anything extra with you?

### **Health and Safety**

You need to take responsibility for your own Health and Safety and those around you. At the start of the work experience placement, you should receive an induction which as a minimum should include:

- Tour of the working area/premises
- Fire procedures
- First aid arrangements
- Overview of expected tasks during the week
- Prohibited tasks and/or areas
- Requirements for personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Introduction to colleagues
- Confirmation of working hours and breaks
- Shown welfare facilities

### **Employer Expectations**

Prior to the placement, it is a good idea for you to research your employer to gain a basic knowledge of the company in order to understand the possible expectations that the employer will have.

Employer expectations will also be discussed at the pre-placement meeting. However, you should be aware of the expectations that all employers will have;

- Positive attitude
- Show interest
- Polite and friendly
- Ability to follow instructions/listening skills
- Hard working
- Punctual and reliable
- Appearance and hygiene appropriately dressed.

### **Your Expectations**

You may have a different expectation of what a placement will be like compared to reality. Therefore you should have realistic expectations. Age, lack of experience, lack of training, knowledge, skills and health and safety restrictions will limit some of the tasks that you can do.

Time will be spent observing colleagues especially in environments that are high risk such as building/construction, garages and engineering.

Routine tasks such as cleaning, tidying, filing etc will be done. A full working day will be undertaken in the majority of placements not 'school hours'

# Verbal and Non-verbal Communication

You should ask questions to show interest and be aware of negative and positive body language. Examples of positive body language are:

- Making eye contact
- Sitting up straight
- Paying attention
- Relaxed posture
- Keeping hands out of pockets

Examples of negative body language are:

- Staring
- Slouching
- Yawning
- Crossed arms and legs
- Looking at your watch

### Mobile Phones/Social Media

Use of mobile phones will not be allowed during the placement 'working hours'. You may be asked to place phones in bags or lockers or as a minimum phones should be turned off or placed on 'silent'.

Mobile phones are not permitted in childcare/school placements due to safeguarding procedures. Inappropriate content and use of social media whilst on placements may result in placements being terminated.

### **Working Hours**

Placements will take place between a Monday – Friday during term time. The maximum number of hours you can work will be 8 hours which would include a 1 hour break. You will be informed of the exact times of the placement by your employer. You will not be paid whilst on work experience, as it is an educational experience not employment.

### **Absences**

If you are going to be late for your placement then you should:

- Contact the employer.
- Apologise to say that you will be late and explain the reason.
- Provide an expected arrival time.
- If you are unable to attend the placement due to illness:
- Contact the employer.
- Explain reason for absence.
- Provide an expected return date.
- You should also follow correct protocol for informing school of illness. Please ensure you call the absence line for each day of illness.

### **Placement Reflection**

Work experience should be treated as a 'learning experience' and not just a week out of school.

Therefore you need to reflect upon your placement to consolidate what you learnt and apply to your future career planning and goal setting. You should ask yourself;

- Did you enjoy the placement and was it beneficial?
- What new skills did you learn and develop?
- Do you now have an idea of what employers require from their employees?
- Has it given you a better idea of what career path you want to take?

If you didn't enjoy the experience this is also a positive thing! Now you can investigate other career paths which may be of interest.

### Work Experience A Guide for Parents/Carers/And Guardians

### What is a work experience placement?

A placement with an employer in which a young person carries out a range of tasks in much the same way as an employee, with the emphasis on learning from the experience. Work experience provides opportunities for learning about the skills, behaviours, careers, roles and structures that exist within a workplace.

# How do students benefit from a Work Experience placement?

Work experience supports young people to make career decisions, develop employability skills and support successful transition into FE, HE, apprenticeships and the workplace.

- Improved self esteem
- Ability to communicate with adults
- Improved timekeeping
- Additional practical work skills
- Team working

### What type of work can students do?

There are a wide variety of placements available and there are very few occupational placements that are prohibited to a student. In some cases legislation imposes restrictions on the type of work which students can do, these restrictions are designed to protect students from occupations unsuitable for them.

Due to a student's inexperience and age some tasks may only be completed under strict supervision or may, in exceptional circumstances, be observation only. The emphasis, however, is always on trying to provide an interesting and well balanced placement.

## How much are students paid whilst on Work Placements?

Students must not be paid whilst on Work Experience, as it is an educational experience not employment. However, employers may wish to make a contribution to expenses; e.g. fares and meals.

# What hours can a student work whilst on a Work Experience Placement?

Students should not work for more than 5 days in any consecutive seven day period and it is a requirement that students should not work more than a standard eight-hour day or forty hours in a week. They should not work excessively long hours or unnecessarily unsocial hours. The number of hours worked together with the pattern of work is normally a matter of agreement by the employer, school and student. Some industries work on shift basis or work evenings, please discuss this with employer and ensure travel arrangements suit later working. Students can work up until 10pm in these cases.

### Are there particular Health & Safety considerations?

All placements will be vetted by the ESCC work experience team prior to the student attending their work placement to ensure the Health, Safety and welfare of the student during the experience. The school will be provided with a copy of the placement assessment for the placement.

### How can Parents/Carers help?

Young people need to be motivated and determined in order to make the most of the opportunity that a Work Placement presents. Parents/Carers should encourage their Son/Daughter to think of the type of placement that they believe they would like to have. Discuss your sons/daughters interests, career




prospects or hobbies when deciding what type of placement would be more beneficial to them. On a practical level, Parents/Carers can help by making sure of the following:

- Knowing where your child will be going and what they will be doing
- · What will your child's working hours be
- What the contact details are for your child's employer and also for the school.
- That your child contacts the employer before
   Work Experience is due to begin in order to
   confirm arrangements:
  - Exactly where to go on the first day
  - Lunch arrangements
  - Working times

Ensure that your child is prepared for the first day: Bus fares Appropriate clothing Packed lunch / lunch money How to get to the placement in plenty of time

In the run up to Work Experience your child should be reminded that the provision of Work Experience placements is entirely due to the goodwill and to the generosity of employers.
