Prior learning- linked to National curriculum	Students will have had varying degrees of learning about Judaism at KS1&2, as well as cursory introductions to aspects of the religion in the previous module (7.1 What is Religion?)
Rationale	The module will look in-depth at the origins, beliefs, teaching, and practices of Judaism, in its capacity as the foundational religion of western civilisation (law, rights, theology etc.) as well as its various expressions in the modern world (especially in the UK). The scheme of work will also prepare students for a later module on Christianity, which can only properly be understood in reference to its Jewish context.

Cultural Capital:	The origins of our legal system and the concept of human rights.
