Students learn techniques and use software that is of value in KS4.

Cultural Capital:	Being able to describe and communicate original ideas through different forms of communication.
Key assessments- name the assessments	Assessment grid of tasks to show achievement and progress across the module. This includes a challenge task.
What do children know/ can do now (EDSM)	Rather than be forced to think of original ideas by looking at a piece of A3 paper and 'thinking hard,' students should have a range of techniques that will help to inspire and spark thoughts that can be built upon.
