## History Year9 How have women's experiences changed over history?

Year group 9	Subject: How have women's experiences changed over history?
Prior learning- linked to National curriculum	We have included this unit of work towards the end of KS3 as students will have the maturity and social understanding of some of the key issues surrounding women, trans history and LGBTQ+. They would have already studied several thematic studies in previous years, such as Power (Year 7) and Conflicts (Year 8), and so have a conceptual understanding of how experiences change over time.
Rationale	This unit of work aims to broaden and deepen students' understanding of women in history, as part of our commitment to having a diverse history curriculum. As a thematic study, students will develop their chronological understanding whilst also focusing specifically on the experiences of women and how they have changed over time. Students will also be able to identify similarities and differences between different groups of women (e.g. class, ethnicity, sexuality) in each time period.
