

## RE Year 8 What is Hinduism?

<b>Year group: 8</b>	<b>Subject: What is Hinduism?</b>
<b>Prior learning- linked to National curriculum</b>	Students will have had varying degrees of learning about Hinduism at KS1&2, as well as cursory introductions to the aspects of religion in year 7.
<b>Rationale</b>	<p>The module will look in-depth at the origins, beliefs, teaching, and practices of Hinduism, in its capacity as the foundational religion of eastern traditions, as well as its various expressions in the modern world (especially in the UK).</p> <p>The scheme of work will also prepare students for later modules on Buddhism and Sikhism, which can only properly be understood in reference to their Hindu origins.</p>
