


mornings and evenings, it's impressive to see those who have been making the concerted effort to get up and show up to school every morning.


## Year 10

# Year 11

Merry Christmas Everyone,

Term 2 has come to a close and it feels like I've blinked and missed it its gone so fast. Lessons are calm and even more productive, with students working hard over the last 6 weeks. One of the main focuses for students this term has been exploring the different colleges and courses available to them.

Understandably this is a very stressful process as pupils want to make the correct choices for their futures. All the colleges in the local area are very different, so it is vitally important that pupils take the opportunities to visit the campuses and get a proper feel for the courses. There will be one that fits for each and every one of you.

There is still time to apply but this now needs to be a priority so please do not hesitate to contact myself or Jemma Newman if you or your child would like further support with this.

Aside from the mocks and college applications, the term has been filled with a variety of events. For Yr11 this started with a visit from East Sussex Safer Roads campaign. The pupils sat and watch what was a very relevant but hard-hitting performance to emphasise some of the choices they will possibly be facing in the not so distant future. The performance covered a wide variety of scenarios and the possible outcomes that they could bring. Next PCS invited in local companies to run an Employers Interview day. We have done this in the past with huge success so were very excited about being able to run this again this year. It is such an important experience for our Yr11's as it gives them the opportunity to practice interview techniques with strangers before their college interviews. To see the powerful impact it had on the students was incredible. The nerves before going in and then the beaming smiles after they had received such positive feedback. In both of these events, the pupils represented themselves, the school and myself extremely well, demonstrating high levels of maturity and poise.

Last week the Government released further information regarding the year 11 exams. It is a relief to all of us that they recognise the impact that the pandemic has had on their learning. There is a brief summary below:

"I write to update you about the nature of the advance information, on the content of some GCSE, exams, which the exam boards will be publishing by 7 February 2022.

As you are aware, the first ever publication of advance information in general qualifications is a key adaptation to examinations, aiming to support students and teachers in focusing revision for exams. It is intended to make sure that we are being as fair as possible to students given the disruption they have experienced, and many continue to face, due to the coronavirus pandemic.

In some cases, for example, the information will provide a list of topics that will be the focus of the exam, or parts of it. In other cases, the information will identify a section of a set work (such as a text), and the extract used in the exam will be taken from this smaller section."

Advance information will:

- help focus revision time
- vary in breadth, depth and presentation between subjects
- not detail everything in the exam (this could risk providing a balanced education, progression or fair results)
- not require changes to a question paper's usual structure (so exam papers will be familiar to teachers and students)
- not be allowed into the exam

On Thursday this week, myself and Mrs Jenkins have launched a new Intervention and Incentives drive to help encourage pupils to take all the opportunities offered to them. There will Intervention sessions running most nights of the week, enabling pupils to continue their learning and progress outside of timetabled lessons.

It is vitally important that Yr 11 attend as many of these sessions as they can as this can only have a positive impact of their progress. This term I have walked down the corridor at the end of the day and seen pupils still so engaged in their learning. This has been such a heart-warming experience. If you are someone who has been invited to attend these sessions please make sure you snap up the invite and make this your goal in the New Year.

Looking ahead to the New Year, I would just like to emphasise the importance of the following areas – attendance, revision, and mocks. All of these three areas are intertwined and can impact on each other, either positively or negatively. The best advice I can give at this time is to be at school each and every day,



work hard in your lessons but understand that there is a necessity for each one of you to complete work at home or at intervention sessions. Take the second set of mock exams extremely seriously and take on board all the lessons that the first set of mock exams gave you. There is still plenty of time to impact the end results, never forget that.

That just leaves me to wish you all a very happy and healthy Christmas holiday with your family and friends. Relax, recharge the batteries, do some revision and come back ready to hit the ground running. Please be mindful of your communities around you, be kind and considerate to all. I look forward to seeing you all in the New Year to tackle the obstacles together.
