- 3.2 million people work in the Creative Industries in the UK
- £115 billion goes into the UK economy from these industries every year
- It contributes more to the UK economy every year than the automotive, life sciences, aerospace and oil & gas industries combined
- 9.6% of UK jobs are in the Creative Industries-that's nearly 1 in 11 jobs in the UK!

- The sector is growing 5 x faster than the UK national economy
- Massive growth in remote and hybrid working post pandemic.
- UK has 20 new TV/Film studios opening before 2030!
- Online development has developed many jobs in the creative industries that didn't exist 10 years ago










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
