Every year, we look for help from our current Year 7 students to give advice and support to new students from a peer point of view, after all, they are the experts!

We have found that our Year 7 students rise to the challenge and amaze us with their kindness, insight and words of wisdom for Year 6 students. This week we were asked the following question.

What is the transition from Primary school to PCS like?

Firstly, I would like to assure you that the transition between Year 6 and Year 7 is not as hard as it may first seem.

That is not to say that it is not nerve-racking, and I am sure that many of you, as everyone at PCS once was, are nervous.
